**ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Urgent Care Matters is seeking a Licensed Physician as a medical provider interested in growing with thriving and busy urgent care centers. Providers can be Family Practice, Med-Peds or ER trained with preferred experience in urgent care medicine. The ideal candidate will be responsible for direct patient care in a suburban or urban urgent care setting and should feel comfortable treating pediatric, adult and geriatric patients. Additional duties include, but are not limited to: Occupational Medicine, Primary Care Medicine, X-ray, EKG interpretations, minor surgical procedures and fracture care.

**GENERAL DESCRIPTION AND ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS (The descriptions are not considered all-inclusive):**

- Provide immediate medical care for acute and chronic illnesses and injury.
- Perform X-ray interpretation (chest, fractures, and abdomen), and EKG interpretation.
- Suturing lacerations, incision and drainage of abscesses, and other minor surgical procedures.
- Fracture care including splinting.
- Participate in the centers' Occupational Medicine, and Primary Care divisions.
- Stabilize and expedite transport of acutely ill patients to the nearest emergency department. This may include but is not limited to bag-valve-mask, CPR, and the intravenous administration of life sustaining/saving medications.
- React calmly and effectively in emergency situations.
- Assume the role of supervisor for the center during shift.
- Participate in community outreach and education initiatives.
- Demonstrate a willingness to adjust responsibilities and patient load to accommodate a fast-paced work environment.
- Maintain excellent customer service.
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with patients and medical staff.

**QUALIFICATION AND EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS**

- Licensed Physician trained in Emergency Medicine, Urgent Care Medicine, Family Practice or Medicine-Pediatrics. Certificate of completion of an approved Medical Assistant program.
- Must have DEA, CDS, and CPR. ACLS, PALS, DOT Provider Certification preferred but not required.
- Previous urgent care work experience is highly desirable.
- Trained in accredited US residency.
- Licensed in the State of Maryland. No J-1 visas.



**WORKING SCHEDULE**

- An average of two 12 hour shifts per week for part-time obligation or a minimum of three 12 hour shifts for full time obligation.
- Both part time and full time providers will be expected to work some weekends and holidays.
